We held our OAT Student Leadership elections in February 2022 to find 2 representatives from our academy who will represent us at the **East Regional Student Voice** meetings. A number of our Student Leaders attended the last inter school virtual **Youth Council Meeting**, where they heard about various initiatives from Get Suffolk Reading and our local Environmental Sustainability Officer. They also created mind maps linked to three priorities (mental health, environmental awareness and awareness and understanding of how people are different) that had previously been chosen as issues important to young people.

Our Student Leaders formed an **Eco-Schools** Council encouraging change at Ormiston Denes, and within their families, to help protect the environment and habitat from pollution and other things that lead to environmental deprivation. They have been working very hard to obtain the Eco-Schools Green Flag Award for the academy.

They have completed their assessment and are working on three major topics: Marine (plastic in our oceans), School Grounds (eco garden) and Waste (recycling). Two students have volunteered to represent Ormiston Denes at the OAT National Eco-Schools Council Meetings. We have been involved with: The Big Plastic Count and Earth Day 2022, and we are currently working on our Eco-Garden and The National Literacy Trust – Eco Literacy Champions Group.

## Celebration



On Friday 27th May 2022 the **Festival of Suffolk Torch** Relay arrived in Lowestoft, with Mayor Alan Green carrying the torch in a special Festival E-Rickshaw, as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

celebrations. Over a 588 mile route, 250 torch bearers, each nominated community champions, had been nominated to carry the torch. We nominated our head student Archie, in recognition of all the events that he has participated in over his time with us. Archie had actively participated in the civic Remembrance Day services, Holocaust Memorial Day services, including a performance of Suitcase 1938 held at the Lowestoft Train Station in 2020. Archie has also organised, directed and performed in 'A Midsummer's Night Dream' to raise money for Norfolk LGBT+ charity, as well as supporting numerous events and activities in school.

We were very excited to hear that the Council Events Committee chose Archie to represent Lowestoft in the relay and, on Saturday 28th May, Archie was passed the torch from Mayor Green and then proceeded to ride in the E-Rickshaw on its next part of the journey. This took Archie through the town and then up the seafront, passing numerous spectators and over 400 members participating in the local park run, who all cheered him on.



As an academy we are very proud of Archie and the fact he was chosen for such an important event.

Students came together to show support for their school's LGBT community in their annual Pride celebrations. Ormiston Denes Academy marked Pride with a week of events, including assemblies, a daily Pride picnic and a whole-school event on Friday.

They were visited by the Norfolk LGBT Project and Access Community Trust's Place of Pride who spoke about the services they offer and held a Pride merchandise sale.

The school's vocal group performed and the Ormiston Denes Pride Committee raised the rainbow flag at the front of the school. Pride Group Co-ordinator Polly Grice said: "It was wonderful to mark Pride with our students and it's really special to see them feeling comfortable to be who they are and celebrate with our wider school community.

"Our student-led Pride committee has worked hard all year to make our school a place where we celebrate diversity and it was lovely to be able to celebrate with them."
