## Introducing our Arts & Graphics Department

My name is Jo Westgate. I am Head of Art. This is now my 21<sup>st</sup> year of working at the Ormiston Denes. I work with Jess Fellas who has taught alongside me for 11 years and Amy Barwood our Art technician who has supported the department for 10 years. Our backgrounds are all very different, I studied at The University of Chichester taking Art with Related Arts. Jess studied at University of Reading taking Fine Art and History of Art and finally Amy studied at Norwich University of the Arts taking Fine Art. Our specialism and expertise are all very different which enables us to offer a broad curriculum and meet the needs of our students. We are also really lucky at Ormiston Denes to have Maxine Rudd, who also holds a degree in Art and Design. She volunteers her own time to run a KS3 art club after school. The students get to continue to build on their skills tapping into Maxine's skill set of printmaking. Students are creating their own designs to print onto tote bags.

The creative sector is one of the UK's biggest growing industries; including fashion, visual arts, publishing TV and film. With the ever growing and changing needs of this sector, we have increased our offer of the creative subjects and now offer students GCSE's in Art & Design, Graphics and Photography. This enables us to tailor skills to suit and allow students to make choices.

The Art and Design course encourages students to be independent, making creative choices in three main skill areas of painting, drawing and sculpture. Photography is art through a lens. Students explore photography through digital and practical/manual manipulation. Graphics is the newest course we offer and is a bridge between the two subjects. This is more tailored towards advertising, illustration and publishing. Students develop their skills again both manually and use ICT and photoshop to aid

A student's educational experience is really important to their learning process. As a department we like to get them to experience the Art firsthand through the offer of trips and artist workshops. Our yr10 Art and Graphics students went to NUA to see the end of Year show and get a taste for the range of courses they have on offer. Yr10 Art got to work alongside Sue Brinkhurst to create mixed media collages inspired by the old post office building in the town centre. Our students work was then part of the exhibition put on inside the building.

To support our students in their preparation for their Yr11 exam, we annually fund a trip to London for them to gather primary research to help inspire them leading up to the exam. This is always a really exciting with this year looking round the Natural History Museum and the Victoria and Albert.

We always like to celebrate students consistent hard work in lessons and showcase the work they all create. We do this weekly through our Instagram account—ODA Art&Tech.
