

A CLOSER LOOK: WOMEN'S FOOTBALL



In September 2022, VotesforSchools asked if the Lionesses' win at the Euros would create long-lasting change, and it was nearly a draw: 45% said Yes, and 55% said No.

After the tournament, the Lionesses used their influence to write to the Government asking them to give girls equal opportunities to play football in schools as boys. Since then, teachers around the UK have said that they have noticed more girls playing football in the playground, and more schools now have girls' or mixed football teams.

Former Lioness Karen Carney has also recently published a report recommending that women's football is given a prime slot on UK television and that the Women's Super League & Women's Championship become fully professional.


School's out for... autumn?
