As well as having a team of adults to support students, at Ormiston Denes Academy we also now have a group of selected students, who will receive training as part of the Diana Award Anti-Bullying Programme, they will be our Anti-bullying Ambassador Leads.

The Diana Award Anti-Bullying Programme raises awareness of bullying behaviour and supports schools and young people to tackle it across the UK and beyond. The Anti-Bullying Ambassador Programme has a strong peer-to-peer focus, giving young people the skills and confidence to become Ambassadors to tackle any unkindness or bullying behaviour in our Academy, long after the training has finished.



The Diana Award anti-bullying work is recognised as world-class thanks to this sustainable and youthled approach. Our students will be trained in spotting the signs of bullying, and act as points of contact for anyone requiring support. They are then able to alert the pastoral team of any concerns, so that they can be acted upon. In seeing these ambassadors show compassion and kindness to others, as well as an intolerance to unkindness and bullying behaviour, we hope they will act as role models, and other students are then more likely to admire this behaviour and incorporate it into their own interactions with their peers.

We are also hoping to then train more of our students to become ambassadors fostering a community that will be dedicated to kindness and support.

Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths

Students from years 9 and 10 had the opportunity to attend a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) careers event at The Energy Skills Centre, East Coast College, where they had the opportunity to meet local employers within the STEM field, look at post 16 college courses that will be available to them, including BTECs, Apprenticeships and T Levels.

There were employers from construction, civil engineering, engineering, clean energy and maritime present, to be on hand to talk about the wide range of jobs available in these fields, and the best routes to get into the industries.

Students were also able to experience hands on and interactive tasks, including steering a ship on their navigation bridge simulator, driving groundworks machinery on their simulator and experience working from heights. This highlighted the skills also needed in these careers.

Our thanks go to East Coast College for hosting such a useful event and for inviting our students to attend.





It was also lovely to hear from two ex students, Keiren and Alfie, currently studying the L2 Engineering course, about just how much they are enjoying their course, and hoping that it will lead both of them into an apprenticeship over the next few months.

Remembrance at Ormiston Denes 2023

On 10th November we held our own act of respect and remembrance in recognition of those who have served our country. Students from organised groups such as St John Ambulance and the Cadets attended in their uniforms and took part in a short service involving readings from Maci and Jess. The Principal's reading echoed an old tradition and was the citation for the Victoria Cross awarded to Claude Castleton, a former student who lost his life saving injured comrades at the Battle for Pozieres 1916. This reading tied to the original unveiling of the memorial clock which is one hundred years old this year and still has central position in our Entrance Hall. The site team worked hard to ensure the clock was looking its best in preparation for this morning, with fresh paint for its casing and a polish up of all the internal cogs.


