

Dear Parents/Carers 3rd January 2024

We look forward to welcoming all students back to the academy tomorrow (Thursday 4th January 2024). Breakfast Club begins as usual at 7.45am and those not attending this should be at the academy for the first bell at 8.35am.

Remember every day of attendance counts and it is essential that all children attend the two days of education available this week. We want all students to begin the term with the aim of improving their attendance, accessing attendance rewards and ideally reaching 100%. We know that getting back into a routine can be hard and you can support your child by ensuring that their uniform is ready for tomorrow morning, they have their five a day ready and in their school bag and that they get a good night's sleep tonight.
