## Free Webinar for Parents/Carers


We have been working so some time with the St Giles Trust, who are a charity working with people facing disadvantages such as homelessness, long term unemployment, severe poverty, and involvement in gangs. The Trust recently led age-appropriate assemblies and are offering a free webinar for parents. ## Discretionary Grants from the Household Support Fund.

Suffolk County Council (SCC) have confirmed that the Household Support Fund is available until March 2024, meaning a further discretionary grant is available to support low-income families over the **February half term** and **Easter holidays 2024**. The grant will be issued as a **£45** supermarket voucher for each eligible child from our provider **Pluxee** to cover both the February Half term (£15) and Easter holidays (£30).

May I also remind any parents who are still to redeem their Pluxee voucher for the Christmas holidays, to do so before their expiry date. Once this voucher has expired, it cannot be reissued.
