## **Upcoming Year 7 GL Assessments**

After the half-term break, our Year 7 students will begin a three-week period of assessments in **English**, **Maths**, and **Reading**. These assessments are a valuable opportunity to measure the progress students have made during their first year at the academy and to inform how we support their continued development.

## What Will Be Assessed?

## • English and Mathematics:

Students will complete curriculum-based assessments designed to evaluate their understanding and skills in these core subjects. The results are benchmarked against national averages, allowing us to compare our students' performance with peers across the country. This helps us tailor our curriculum and teaching strategies to ensure the best outcomes for every learner.

 Reading (NGRT – New Group Reading Test): This nationally standardised test assesses both decoding (the ability to read words accurately) and comprehension (understanding and interpreting meaning). The NGRT provides a detailed picture of each student's reading ability, which is crucial for success across all subjects.

## Why Reading Matters

Strong reading skills are essential—not just for English, but for success in **Mathematics, Science, and beyond**. Research shows that students with lower reading ages often struggle to access the language-rich content of modern GCSE exams, which have become increasingly demanding since 2017. In fact, the link between reading





ability and achievement in Mathematics is stronger than in some traditionally text-heavy subjects like English Literature and History. That's why we place such a strong emphasis on developing reading skills early.

These assessments are not just about scores—they help us:

- Identify strengths and areas for improvement
- Personalise learning support
- Ensure every student is on track for long-term academic success
