ORMISTON DENES ACADEMY ASPIRATION, INTEGRITY, RESPECT

Ormiston Denes Academy has been through several stages on its route to the great school that it is today. The school first opened its doors in 1910 as Lowestoft Municipal Secondary School. The cost of the new building was £9,143 and it was designed by Messrs Brown and Burgess and built by Charles Roper, both of Ipswich.

In 1920 the school was renamed Lowestoft Secondary School. In 1940, 327 students out of 470 were evacuated to Worksop along with the headmaster and 21 teachers.

After the war, the school changed status to Lowestoft Grammar School and in 1950 became Lowestoft County Grammar School. It remained as a grammar school until 1970 when it became Denes High School. The school was extended to accommodate 1,250 students. In 2004 the Denes became a specialist school in business and enterprise.

In 2013 Ormiston Academies Trust (OAT) was chosen by the governors to become the umbrella organisation. Denes High School became Ormiston Denes Academy. OAT is one of the largest not-for-profit multi-academy trusts in England.

Ormiston Denes Academy is now a Year 7 to Year II academy, welcoming students from the surrounding area. The buildings are very different from 1910, having been extended many times but the site still retains huge playing fields.

The main building, fronting onto the road, is still as beautiful as when it was built, but now has the mature trees to complement it. Come and see for yourself, you will be pleasantly surprised.

CORE VALUES

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Student Leadership is a critical part of our academy, in line with our core value of **Responsibility**. We believe that when students' voices are heard and when young people have the opportunity to lead, they become architects of their futures and active advocates of our community.

Every form has the opportunity to elect a Form Representative, who is responsible for listening and expressing the views of their fellow students to the Student Council. They work alongside Subject Ambassadors, who aim to support curriculum areas through student voice and enrichment opportunities. Leading our Student Leadership team are the Prefects, who are appointed after a rigorous

selection process to represent the whole school and lead on developing their own projects connected to our key priorities.

Finally, all students have the chance to have their voices heard, through initiatives such as our "You Said, We Did" programme, or through student committees including Pride and Environment.

We aim to provide opportunities for students to develop leadership skills as well as facilitating a partnership between students and staff. Nurturing these vital skills during their time in school will directly support them in further education and in their future careers.

CURRICULUM

At Ormiston Denes Academy, we are passionate about ensuring students leave us having fulfilled their potential in a broad range of subjects and have the opportunity to succeed at the highest level.

The curriculum we offer gives the balance of a wide curriculum base in Years 7, 8 and 9 before allowing students to specialise in the subjects they enjoy the most in Year 10. We aim for all aspects of our school life to inspire students to have aspirations and be ambitious. We enhance our students' opportunities and create social justice by ensuring our curriculum is designed for all students to have rigorous academic challenges, whilst enabling them to make positive life choices so they are healthy, polite and respectful.

KEY STAGE 3 (YEARS 7, 8 AND 9)

Years 7, 8 and 9 are organised so that all students cover a broad range of subjects. There is a standard core

curriculum of English, mathematics, science and physical education. Students also study geography, history, personal social and health education (PSHE) and religious education. Technology & performing arts works on a rotation and includes technology, art, catering, IT, music, dance and drama. All students have the opportunity to specialise in one of three languages: French, German or Spanish

KEY STAGE 4 (YEARS 10 AND 11)

Students in Years 10 and 11 continue the core curriculum of English language and English literature, mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics, PSHE/RE and physical education. In Year 9, students made the decision on their option choices for the start of Year 10, either continuing to develop their subject knowledge from Key Stage 3 or choosing a specialist Key Stage 4 course. All students select three options with all having access to the English baccalaureate (Ebacc).

ENRICHMENT, TRIPS AND EXPERIENCES

At Ormiston Denes we see the value of encouraging our students to experience new things and to 'look beyond'. We plan a diverse programme of events and activities to encourage all students to think about their futures and ensure that they 'Aim High.' Our extensive enrichment programme aims to raise achievement and complement the work of teachers in the classroom, challenging all students to excel beyond expectations and embed the time-management skills that they will need in the future. We provide opportunities to engage with higher education providers, outside speakers and attend events that aim to raise aspirations, develop their talents and interests, build on their self-esteem and help them become more effective and independent learners. Through the wealth of activities on offer we ensure that every student has the opportunity to discover and develop existing and new talents and interests as well as reminding them that learning can be fun.

Enrichment is about balancing the learning experience of the 'whole child', ensuring that our students not only perform well academically but that they improve their independent learning skills so that when they leave the academy they do so with the ability to enjoy and continue their learning journey. Enrichment is about equipping our students for the future.

We also run an extensive range of lunchtime and afterschool enrichment activities for students to choose from. Students can just turn up to clubs – no need to book.

Ormiston Denes Academy students are encouraged to participate in as many clubs and activities as possible. This is both to broaden experiences – providing students with additional opportunities to discover something new, and to strengthen understanding – spending additional time on a subject they are interested in or need extra support with.

CELEBRATING SUCCESS

Students deserve to have their successes recognised and valued. Our rewards system celebrates our values system, great effort and excellent achievement. It values students as individuals and their collective efforts.

Weekly assemblies praise and reward students for effort and achievement across various subjects. Recognition is also given to those with the highest number of positive points. Form tutors also nominate students on a weekly basis to attend a Principal's Breakfast for showing Aspiration, Integrity or Respect.

Effort data is analysed on a half-termly basis and form tutors receive an individual report and presentation, which is used to praise and motivate a whole form group and individuals.

On a half-termly basis students are rewarded during assemblies where various prizes are issued with formal certificates.

At the end of each academic year, each year group holds a special Rewards Assembly to celebrate students who have accumulated the most reward points, in a variety of subjects, across the year.

Always getting things right is acknowledged through our termly Club Zero celebratory events.

ACADEMIC AMBITION

At Ormiston Denes Academy, we are passionate about ensuring students leave us having fulfilled their potential in a broad range of subjects and have the opportunity to succeed at the highest level.

As such, the curriculum we offer gives the balance of a wide curriculum base in KS3 before allowing students from Year 10 to specialise in the subjects they enjoy and that will lead to success in the next stage of their education.

Students study PSHE (including RSHE), RE (reflecting the religious traditions in Great Britain and taking into account other principle religions) and PE throughout the five years of their time at the academy.
