We have been running our **David Parr Competition** this week. Private David Allen Parr was a former student at Ormiston Denes Academy who sadly lost his life when serving for the British Army in Falklands War as a member of The Parachute Regiment; aged 19. In honour of his memory every year the academy takes part in a series of fitness tests used for entrance into the British Army to form the "David Parr Competition". The student who scores the highest wins the competition and is awarded the "David Parr Trophy" which was kindly donated by the Parr family in his memory. Students across the academy showed immense respect to when hearing the story of Private Parr and performed at their best to honour his memory. 'Lest We Forget'. The final results will be known next week, however I am told that students in Year 7 and in Year 9 are doing really well!

Governors visited the academy this week and met with students exploring their understanding of equality, diversity and inclusion, safeguarding, digital safeguarding and kindness. Today we are supporting **Children in Need** with a non-uniform day. We are always happy to support this great charity.


